EU Digital Competence Framework

Protecting Devices

To protect devices and digital content, and to understand risks and threats in digital environments. To know about safety and security measures and to have due regard to reliability and privacy.



Protecting Personal Data & Privacy



To understand how to use and share personally identifiable information while being able to protect oneself and others from damages. To understand that digital services use a "Privacy policy" to inform how personal data is used.

Protecting Health & Well-being

To be able to avoid health-risks and threats to physical and psychological well-being while using digital technologies. To be able to protect oneself and others from possible dangers in digital environments. To be aware of digital technologies for social wellbeing and social inclusion.



Protecting Environment



Goal: to be aware of the environmental impact of digital technologies and their use.

What is 'cyberbullying'?

Cyberbullying Research Center defines a cyberbully as someone who "repeatedly harasses, mistreats, or makes fun of another person online".



LOG OFF the site where the bullying is happening.



SAVE THE MESSAGE or email and show an adult.



BLOCK EMAILS or messages. Don't respond to them.



TELL SOMEONE you trust.
